### Royal Canadian Marine Search & Rescue

I had the pleasure of visiting the highly trained volunteers of the Royal Canadian Marine Search and Rescue Station 2 at Lynnwood Marina in North Vancouver. They cover a large area from English Bay up to Indian Arm, through one of the most challenging and busiest ports in Canada.

With a coastline of 26,000 kilometres, RCMSR stays busy throughout the year. There are 40 stations that work on keeping our waters safe. Last year there were more than 600 on-water emergencies recorded. We are grateful for the dedication of all the volunteers who are ready to assist at a moment's notice.



### West Vancouver Police Ride-Along

In August I had the opportunity to join Constable McGuffie on a ride-along with the West Vancouver Police. It was interesting to see the variety and complexity of the work they do on to keep our community safe. This experience will also be beneficial to me as I continue my Legislative work on the Select Standing Committee to Reform the Police Act.

### Grouse Mountain

A popular summer and winter destination, Grouse Mountain has something for everyone.



I recently visited Grouse Mountain to learn more about the many attractions the mountain has to offer. If you are an outdoor enthusiast, you have a choice of conquering the grouse grind, a 2.9 kilometre hike straight up the mountain, or you may prefer a more leisurely stroll on the mountain with the family.

I recommend meeting Grinder and Coola (if they haven't gone to bed yet), the local grizzly bears at the wildlife refuge, watching a Birds of Prey demonstration, or enjoying something a little more adventuresome like zip lining. When the snow arrives, you can ski, snowboard, snowshoe or skate on the outdoor rink. Our community is fortunate to have such a wonderful family destination in our backyard.

### COVID-19 updates from the BC Centre for Disease Control

[Register with the get vaccinated system](#)

You can register yourself or a parent, grandparent or child online or by phone. Vaccinations for children ages 5-11 are coming soon, and you can now register your child in advance.

[Get your 3rd dose](#)

You will be contacted by the Provincial Get Vaccinated system about how and when to book a third dose. If you've selected email or SMS communication, you'll be sent a link to book an appointment online.

If you've asked to be contacted by phone, a call centre agent will call you to book an appointment.

If you believe you meet the criteria of people who are moderately to severely immunocompromised and haven't been contacted, get in touch with your health care provider.

You don't need a third dose to be considered fully vaccinated on your BC Vaccine Card. To be considered fully vaccinated a second dose must be received by October 24<sup>th</sup>.
